MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

BETWEEN THE CITY OF ENID

AND THE

OKLAHOMA STATE HISTORIC PRESERVATION OFFICER
REGARDING THE DEMOLITION OF PROPERTY AT 715 EAST MAPLE

WHEREAS the City of Enid (City) has determined that demolition of the property at 715 East Maple, Enid, Oklahoma, with federal financial assistance from its Community Development Block Grant program (undertaking) will have an adverse effect upon the property which is a contributing resource to the East Hill Historic District which is eligible for the National Register of Historic Places under Criterion C and has consulted with the Oklahoma State Historic Preservation Officer (SHPO) pursuant to 36 CFR Part 800, regulations implementing Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act (16 U.S.C. Section 470f); and

WHEREAS, in accordance with 36 CFR Section 800.6(a)(1), the City has notified the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation (Council) of its adverse effect determination with specified documentation and the Council has chosen not to participate in the consultation pursuant to 36 CFR Section 800.6(a)(1)(iii); and

NOW THEREFORE, the City and the Oklahoma SHPO agree that the undertaking shall be implemented in accordance with the following stipulations in order to take into account the effect of the undertaking on historic properties.

STIPULATIONS

Prior to demolition of the historic property, the City shall provide to and receive approval from the Oklahoma SHPO of documentation to supplement the documentation on file in the State Historic Preservation Office for the property. The City shall produce a corrected "Historic Preservation Resource Identification Form" for the property and shall consult with the Oklahoma SHPO about the corrections needed in the form currently on file with the SHPO. Additionally, the City shall produce good quality photographic prints from 35mm negatives of all elevations of the historic property to supplement the views of the front facade currently on file with the SHPO. These photographs shall be produced in accordance with the instructions contained in the Oklahoma SHPO's Review and Compliance Manual. However, if the City and the Oklahoma SHPO determine that these additional views cannot be obtained due to the proximity of other buildings and structures, the Oklahoma SHPO shall consider the photographs on file to be sufficient.

Execution of this Memorandum of Agreement by the City of Enid and Oklahoma SHPO and submission of documentation and filing of this Memorandum of Agreement with the Council pursuant to 36 CFR Section 800.6(b)(1)(iv) prior to the City of Enid's approval of this undertaking, and implementation of its terms, evidence that the City of Enid has taken into account the effects of this undertaking on historic properties and afforded the Council an opportunity to comment.
