

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

SUBMITTED TO THE ADVISORY COUNCIL ON HISTORIC PRESERVATION

PURSUANT TO 36 CFR 800.6(a)

WHEREAS, the Department of the Army (Army) has determined that the demolition of a railroad trestle and associated earthen berm will have an effect upon Building 1815 at Fort Sill, Oklahoma, a property eligible for inclusion in the National Register of Historic Places, and has consulted with the Oklahoma State Historic Preservation Officer (SHPO) pursuant to 36 CFR Part 800, regulations implementing Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act (16 U.S.C. 470f);

NOW, THEREFORE, the Army and the Oklahoma SHPO agree that the undertaking shall be implemented in accordance with the following stipulations in order to take into account the effect of the undertaking on historic properties.

Stipulations

The Army will ensure that the following measures are carried out:

- 1) A copy of the complete set of as-built construction drawings of Building 1815 and associated outbuildings and features will be provided to the Oklahoma SHPO. A second complete set of as-built construction drawings will be curated at the Fort Sill Museum.

- 2) Photographic documentation of the existing condition of Building 1815 and the railroad trestle and associated earthen berm will be undertaken. This documentation will be conducted using black-and-white film and 35mm or 120mm camera format. Eight by ten inch copies of all photographic documentation will be provided to the Oklahoma SHPO, and all photographic negatives will be curated at the Fort Sill Museum.

Execution of this Memorandum of Agreement by the Army and the Oklahoma SHPO, its subsequent acceptance by the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation (Council), and implementation of its terms, evidence that the Army has afforded the Council an opportunity to comment on the demolition of the railroad trestle and associated earthen berm at Building 1815, Fort Sill, Oklahoma, and its effect on historic properties, and that the Army has taken into account the effects of the undertaking on historic properties.
