MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

REGARDING THE DEMOLITION OF BUILDINGS 2300, 2301 AND 2302, FORT SILL, OKLAHOMA

WHEREAS, the Department of the Army (Army) has determined that the demolition of Buildings 2300, 2301, and 2302 at Fort Sill, Oklahoma, will have an effect on historic properties that are eligible for inclusion in the National Register of Historic Places, and has consulted with the Oklahoma State Historic Preservation Officer (SHPO) pursuant to 36 CFR Part 800, regulations implementing Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act (16 U.S.C. 470f);

NOW, THEREFORE, the Army, and the Oklahoma SHPO agree that the undertaking shall be implemented in accordance with the following stipulations in order to take into account the effect of the undertaking on historic properties.

Stipulations

The Army will ensure that the following measures are carried out:

- 1) A copy of the complete set of as-built construction drawings of Buildings 2300, 2301, and 2302 will be provided on mylar at reduced scale to the Oklahoma SHPO. A second complete set of as-built construction drawings on mylar will be curated at the Fort Sill Museum.
- 2) Photographic and archival documentation will be developed following general standards identified for Historic American Building Survey (HABS) Level II documentation. Photographic documentation of the existing condition of Buildings 2300, 2301, and 2302 will be undertaken using black-and-white film and 4x5 inch camera format. Copies of all photographic and written documentation will be provided to the Oklahoma SHPO and the Fort Sill Museum, and all photographic negatives will be curated at the Fort Sill Museum. Historic context information will be prepared on the construction and past use of the facilities. Copies of this information will also be provided to the Oklahoma SHPO and the Fort Sill Museum. Buildings 2300, 2301, and 2302 have been recorded

on Historic Preservation Resource Identification Forms and documented with appropriate photographs.

Execution of this Memorandum of Agreement and implementation of its terms evidence that the Army has met the requirements of Section 106 regarding the demolition of Buildings 2300, 2301, 2302 and its effects on historic properties pursuant to 36 CFR 800.6(b)(1)(iv), and that the Army has taken into account the effects of the undertaking on historic properties.
