

MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT  
SUBMITTED TO THE ADVISORY COUNCIL ON HISTORIC PRESERVATION  
PURSUANT TO 36 CFR 800.6(a)

WHEREAS, the Southwest Region of the National Park Service has determined that the Veterans Dam Spillway Modification Project will have an effect upon the Travertine Historic District of Chickasaw National Recreation Area, Murray County, Oklahoma, a property eligible for inclusion in the National Register of Historic Places, and has consulted with the Oklahoma State Historic Preservation Officer (SHPO) pursuant to 36 CFR Part 800, regulations implementing Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act (16 U.S.C. 470f); and

NOW, THEREFORE, the Southwest Region of the National Park Service and the Oklahoma State Historic Preservation Office agree that the undertaking shall be implemented in accordance with the following stipulations in order to take into account the effect of the undertaking on historic properties.

Stipulations

The Southwest Region of the National Park Service will ensure that the following measures are carried out:

1. The National Park Service shall provide photo documentation of the dam crest according to the standards established by the Historic American Buildings Survey providing a sufficient number of photographs to document all views of the structure. The Service agrees to reserve to Oklahoma State Historic Preservation Officer the right to specify the views.
2. The National Park Service shall provide a narrative history of the construction of the dam and the role of the Civilian Conservation Corps in its construction, and a narrative description of the dam. The Oklahoma State Historic Preservation Office shall reserve the right to review this documentation and require revision if it is not of sufficient completeness.
3. The National Park Service shall provide full-size copies of the working drawings of the dam.

Execution of the Memorandum of Agreement by the Southwest Region of the National Park Service and the Oklahoma State Historic Preservation Office, its subsequent acceptance by the Council, and implementation of its terms, evidence that the National Park Service has afforded the Council an opportunity to comment on the Veterans Dam Spillway Modification Project and its effects on

historic properties, and that the National Park Service has taken into account the effects of the undertaking on historic properties.
